Valley Ridge Preserve

Valley Ridge Preserve is a 145-acre parcel in Richland County, Wisconsin that was donated to Leonardo Academy in January 2008. The preserve is largely covered in woodlands with areas of remnant oak savannah and about 30 acres in former farm fields. Leonardo Academy is restoring the oak savannah, maintaining the forests and working to convert the fields to native prairie over time. Our goal is for the preserve to provide a model that demonstrates sustainable land management practices to other land owners.
